March 19, 2012: HPAI follow up report no. 38 sent to OIE

Ten new outbreaks in commercial poultry is reported from Khulna, Rajshahi, Dhaka, Chittagong districts. Of the total of 49245 birds 2886 numbers died and the rest were destroyed. [[more](#)]

India:

March 19, 2012: Mysterious disease claims another Murrah buffalo

With a number of cattle head succumbing to a mysterious disease almost everyday at Sundana village in this district, the situation seems to have reached an alarming point. A total of 40 cattle head have allegedly died in the village in the past about six weeks though officials disagree with the figure. [[more](#)]

March 19, 2012: 1500 chickens dead, bird flu scare in Siwan

Over 1,500 chicken deaths due to a mysterious disease at Thepaha and Jimsikri villages in Siwan district in the past 15 days triggered fear of a possible bird flu outbreak among the poultry owners. Officials later confirmed it to be due to bacterial infection and unhygienic condition. [[more](#)]

March 18, 2012: NADRS project to be commissioned by April

The National Animal Disease Reporting System (NADRS) project which would monitor outbreak of any zoonotic disease and inform the general public for necessary control measures in time, would be commissioned in the state of Manipur by April. Nepal:

March 21, 2012: Lalitpur marked bird flu infected area
