



Bangladesh:

18 June, 2012: Nine infected with Anthrax in Bogra

Nine persons, including women and children were affected with Anthrax showing severe pain and itching in Bogra and later admitted to Bogra Mohammad Ali Hospital. People affected were involved during cutting, washing and eating of sick cow meat. [\[more\]](#)

18 June, 2012: Cases of Scrub Typhus infection reported

Fifteen cases of Scrub Typhus infection, a communicable disease have been reported from various parts of the district, Kozhikode in Kerala. First reported from Malabar region in the state in 2006, the medical officials say that it is very difficult to know its symptoms mainly because in the initial stage it appears like a common fever.
